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In response to a request from the FSM Ambassador to the US, the US Department of Homeland Security, Office of Citizenship and Information Services (USCIS) made some changes to the I-102 application process for replacement of lost or damaged I94 cards for FSM citizens.

The new changes are summarized as follows:

- Processing of I-102 applications for FSM has been centralized. All FSM citizens who complete the Form I-102 in applying for a replacement I94, will send their completed applications to the USCIS Service Center in Nebraska. This centralization of applications is also the same for the Form I-765 (Employment Authorization Documents - EAD) for FSM citizens.
- The USCIS Fact Sheet, issued February 11, 2005, was corrected on page 3 to show that the I94 actually has 11 digits instead of 14 digits as stated in the previous release of the same letter.
- Lastly but not least, a point of contact at the USCIS Headquarters has been established to liaise with the FSM Embassy in Washington on matters relating to the application process for FSM citizens if problems arise. If FSM citizens are encountering any difficulties in the I94 application process they may contact the FSM Embassy in Washington for further assistance.
